

***Last Night on the Titanic* docks at Mackinac Island's Grand Hotel for weekend of history and romance May 13-14**

Mackinac Island, MI, January 27, 2011 – The majestic ship *Titanic* may have sank nearly a century ago, but the history, romance, and majesty of the doomed ocean liner *Titanic* will be celebrated at the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island for a weekend that will transform the historic hotel into the fateful craft, with hotel guests taking on the roles of actual *Titanic* passengers. For one night the Grand Hotel will be transformed to resemble the first class dining room of the *Titanic*'s maiden voyage. Guests will interact with famous characters including Molly Brown, John Jacob Astor and other actual First Class passengers seated among the diners as the vessel sails into history. Authentic music of the era for dancing will be provided by Grand Hotel's live orchestra. At the end of the evening, the collision will take place, at which time guests will find out if they "survived." *Titanic*-ologists will also enjoy a period fashion show, seminars with experts; and other Edwardian activities over the weekend. The story of *Titanic* captures our imaginations and our hearts because it is literally a ship of dreams," noted Kathy Krajewski, owner of Double Exposure, Inc. "It's sweeping and romantic and epic on so many levels. It's not a story of tragedy? It's a story of hope."
